
Vision



- 15 presentations reaching 1,137 number of 10th graders



Working Together Towards Zero Deaths

- The Impact Teen Drivers program is designed for a classroom setting and it is to include all students whether they are a driver or a passenger.
- We chose to initiate this program with a focus on the 10th grade students because that is the age where most are in the process of obtaining their license or have just received their license. All ITD curriculum adopts an "engage, educate, empower, and evaluate" approach.
- The program focuses on passengers and empowering them to encourage and demonstrate safe behavior every time they get in a car.
- We look at this as a partnership with all traffic safety educators. Driver's Ed instructors educate in their classes, and we want to continue that education in the high school classrooms. The more they hear it, the retention increases.
- Life Without Logan is still the Driver's Education curriculum that the Minnesota State Patrol facilitates in Driver's Ed classes. This program will not be replacing that and will not be used instead of that. The goal is to present this education in a high school setting in order to reach ALL the students.



What is the plan moving forward?

- Continue to add more schools to the program each year. The goal is to add two schools each year.
- Continue to evaluate our efforts by quarterly and annual survey data results.
- Use that survey data to understand where more educational efforts are needed.
