Probation/Parole Supervision

Traditional Supervision – Individuals are supervised according to a

risk/needs assessment

Enhanced Supervision - Individuals are automatically supervised at a high right level for at least one years

at a high-risk level for at least one year

(felony offenders)

DWI/Specialty Court Supervision - Individuals are supervised in a

very intensive Specialty Court situation for a minimum of 18-24

months

Probation/Parole Supervision

Traditional Supervision

▶ In the past Impaired driving offenders were supervised the same as other offenders, either Low, Medium or High Risk. Score depended on the outcome of the LS/CMI.



Enhanced Supervision

- Impaired driving felony offenders are automatically given an override to High Risk and supervised by home visits and office visits.
- Visits include drug/alcohol testing, evidence-based practices, Carey guides, cognitive skills programming.
- Random employment visits also conducted.

Probation/Parole Supervision

▶ DWI/Specialty Court Supervision

- ▶ Most intensive supervision available.
- ▶ Weekly/biweekly contact with the Judge.
- ▶ Random drug/alcohol testing 1-3 times per week.
- ▶ Many local service providers involved.
- Curfew with random curfew checks by law enforcement and/or probation.
- ▶ Treatment participation.
- ► Cognitive skills programming.



Risk/Needs Assessment

- ➤ Traditionally the Level of Service/Case Management Inventory (LS/CMI) has been used by the Department of Corrections for identifying the risk and needs of individuals and basing the individual's supervision level off the score.
- Research has found that the LS/CMI may not be the most accurate risk/needs assessment for the impaired driver population.
- Other risk/needs assessments have been looked at to address the impaired driver population.
- Currently working with Department of Corrections management team on finding something more appropriate for the impaired driver population.



















Probation Recidivism Statistics
