Increased Crash Fatalities 2024

The Minnesota Department of Public Safety report indicates that **speeding** is the state's leading cause of car crashes. Additionally, impaired driving, distracted driving, and not wearing seat belts are also common reasons for traffic fatalities in Minnesota.

We all know that the Minnesota's winter of 2023-2024 was unlike many in recent memory. After one of the snowiest winters every, drivers got a break this past year. One would thing that with no snow and ice, it should make for safer driving—right?

Unfortunately, that doesn't usually happen. When we have a winter as mild as we saw in 2023-2024 where we have clear roads, warm weather, and sunny skies, people are driving more like we see in summer weather. While the winter elements lead to more crashes – the conditions typically lead people to drive slower, meaning crashes are often not fatal. With clear roads, there is generally an uptick in speeding and distracted driving and those increase the likelihood of fatal crashes.

Even a trace of snow, it is important to slow down, increase following distance, and drive a speed that's safe for conditions. Always buckle up and keep your eyes on the road.
